

A successful sign system should minimise anxiety and confusion, should be easy to understand and people with a visual impairment should not be placed at a disadvantage. Configure has developed a signage system which allows bespoke tactile signs to be produced at a fraction of the cost of traditional vacuum formed alternatives.

In addition to the 20,000 people in the UK who read Braille, an estimated 200,000 people who are registered blind can read embossed or tactile signs (signs with raised letters and symbols). Mounting locations for Braille and embossed signs should allow a person to approach and touch the message with ease

Users should not encounter protruding objects or have to stand within the swing of a door

Avoid placing signs at points in reception areas where they may be obscured by deliveries

Ensure that external signs do not become partially covered by plants or trees in leaf

Tactile signs specifically for visually impaired wheelchair users should be located 900 mm from the floor

Signs that are intended to be read at close range, such as directories or identification signs on doors, should be mounted close to the eye line at 1500mm

Configure can supply silver PVC frames for a superior finish

Signs and labels use Grade 1 Braille, the most widely used by readers

Braille indicators positioned on the sign show the user where to find the Braille and give the signs a reference point

Signs and labels are made from very durable, top quality 'Fire Rated' plastics

The materials are designed for our vacuum forming and embossing techniques which give the very best finished product
